Since its establishment in 1983, Taawon has invested 642 USD million in seven major programs: education, community development, youth and women's empowerment, orphan support, culture, restoration of old cities, and its flagship project, The Palestinian Museum.

Work Areas

We work in urban and rural areas of the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, in the refugee camps in Lebanon, and in the 1948 areas.

We work with all segments of Palestinian society, with a focus on children, youth, women, people with special needs, and the underprivileged. In addition, we support the innovations of Palestinian individuals and institutions.

We concentrate our efforts on tackling the symptoms of marginalization and poverty by forming strategic partnerships with our beneficiaries and collaborating with local and international development organizations and government aid agencies. Our programs contribute to creating an ecosystem where Palestinians can flourish, and, in turn, can continue to contribute to Palestine's sustainable development.

Supporting the Homeland, Preserving an Identity

We seek to preserve Palestine's living cultural heritage. We want future generations of Palestinians capable of artistic and cultural self-expression, and of artistic productions for local and international audiences.



Investing in the Future

We empower entrepreneurial Palestinian youth (15-29) to become leaders of social change. We enable them to integrate into the labor market through job placement and training. We also support entrepreneurship and innovative youth-led business startups.

Safeguarding Life and Dignity

We support local communities and institutions through a holistic developmental approach including interventions in agriculture, health, capacity building, and infrastructure development projects. In addition, humanitarian relief, our oldest program, reflects our organization's core value that all individuals are entitled to the basic human needs of food security, water, shelter, education, sanitation, and healthcare.



From Relief to Development

Through the Mustaqbali and Wajd programs, we seek to holistically support all children orphaned during the Israeli assaults on Gaza in 2008 and 2014. Mustagbali and Wajd foster an environment that provides for these children's needs and helps them to build character allowing them to live more normal lives and positively contribute to their families, local communities, and the homeland.





Preserving Heritage

This program sponsors comprehensive reuitalization efforts in run-down neighborhoods in urban and rural areas. It supports the restoration of old buildings, the preservation of architectural heritage, and the rehabilitation of residential housing and infrastructure. The program also creates spaces for cultural, social, and economic activities, which empower communities and improve their living conditions. The work initially focused on the Old City of Jerusalem but has now expanded to other areas of Palestine, such as the city of Nablus and the town of Arrabeh.

A Voice for Every Palestinian

The museum is the culmination of Taawon's work with engaging Palestinians in the homeland and the diaspora. The museum preserves Palestinian history and identity and serves as a platform hosting exchanges between Palestinians and the international community.




Our Investments
